UNDERSTANDING FEED PRODUCTION UK COURSE

A two-day residential course for staff involved with feed manufacturing designed to widen their knowledge on processes and challenges in feed quality, safety, raw materials, equipment, data and process management.

This course provides professional training in the skills and knowledge covering the manufacture and background of animal feed manufacture. The course is being held at Mole Valley Huntworth Mill (SW) & Dugdales Nutrition Mill (NW) which allows for a mix of theoretical and practical training in the art and science of making animal feed.

The course is designed for attendees who are already involved in feed manufacture or management who are looking to gain knowledge and develop the skills they have so they can fully understand the process and effects they can make.

The training will cover feed manufacturing skills which are common to both ruminant and monogastric feed manufacture.

Areas being covered:

- Background of the industry and why feed is manufactured
- Raw materials and associated processes
- Quality systems both physical and safety
- The process and equipment
- Result of making good feed or bad feed
- What affect the operator can and does have
- Maintenance (reactive and planned)
- Ways to improve process efficiency
- Technology and machines new to the industry

Outcome:

The attendees will gain a full understanding of the process, what best practice is and how they can affect the quality and profitability of feed manufacture.
